2. PARTICIPANT CODE OF CONDUCT

Exemplary conduct is expected of all Nationals participants, from their official departure from their home through to their return.

Any behaviour contrary to the spirit of the Nationals or any violation of any Karate Canada, hotel or venue rule or policy will result in appropriate disciplinary action.

Karate Canada is committed to providing a sport, work, and volunteer environment in which all individuals are treated with respect and dignity. Each individual has the right to participate and work in an environment which



promotes equal opportunities and prohibits discriminatory practices. Karate Canada will not tolerate acts of harassment, abuse, bullying, hazing, or other such behaviours.

Nationals participants, including athletes, coaches, team reps, referees, staff and volunteers will:

- Show the same level of respect they would want in return.
- Treat the National's host hotels and competition venue, as well as their staff and fellow patrons, with respect and care.
 - Any damages to these properties or infrastructure due to the actions of a participant(s) will result in disciplinary action and/or financial restitution by the participant(s) involved and/or their PTSO.
- Treat all other participants fairly, regardless of gender, ethnic background, color, sexual orientation, religion, political belief, or economic status.
- Conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the position as a positive role model, and as a representative of their sport and province.
- Respect and adhere to the rules and policies of Karate Canada and the WKF.
- Respect the privacy and dignity of others by not divulging confidential information without consent, except where required by law.
- Consistently display high personal standards and project a favourable image of karate and their respective province/territory.
- Refrain from public criticism of athletes, coaches, team reps, referees, staff and volunteers.
- Refrain from the use of profane, insulting, harassing, or otherwise offensive language.
- Respect the dignity of others. Verbal or physical behaviours that constitute harassment or abuse are unacceptable.
- Not use or advocate or condone the use of drugs or other banned or performance enhancing substances.
- Not provide others with drugs and will not provide those who are underage with alcohol or tobacco products.
- Compete/participate in a spirit of fair play and honesty.



- Refrain from using tobacco products within the competition venue or other areas where prohibited.
- Address fellow athletes, coaches, referees, volunteers, event organizers, spectators, and others associated with the Nationals in a courteous and respectful manner.
- Act in a manner that will bring credit to the Nationals, the sport of karate, and themselves, both within and outside the competition venue and/or competition area.
- Ensure the safety of others and themselves.
- Conduct themselves in a positive and supportive manner.
- Abide by the laws of the province and city in which the Nationals is taking place.
- Prepare themselves for the Nationals competition.
- Be responsible for all their personal items such as identification, personal belongings, and equipment.

Athlete's Oath

In the name of all competitors, I promise that we shall take part in these National Championships respecting and abiding by the rules which govern them, committing ourselves to a sport without doping and without drugs, in the true spirit of karate-do, for the glory of sport and the honour of our teams.

Coach's Oath

In the name of all the coaches and other members of the athletes' entourage, I promise that we shall commit ourselves to ensuring that the spirit of sportsmanship and fair play is fully adhered to and upheld throughout these National Championships, in accordance with the fundamental principles of sport and in the true spirit of karate-do.

Referee's Oath

In the name of all the judges and referees, I promise that we shall officiate in these National Championships with complete impartiality, respecting and abiding by the rules which govern them, in the true spirit of karate-do.



3. NATIONAL COMPETITIONS CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENTS AND ELIGIBILITY POLICY

Karate Canada wishes to remind all registrants of its current "National Championships (Competitions) Citizenship Requirements and Eligibility Policy".

3.1 ELIGIBILITY

Participants may only participate in the National Championships if they meet the following requirement:

The Participant is a Canadian passport holder.

3.2 PROVIDING PROOF OF ELIGIBILITY

All Participants will be required to provide proof of the eligibility requirement listed above no later than the registration deadline through the system or method that Karate Canada will communicate to the PTSOs. Such proof will consist of a valid Canadian passport.

After reviewing all applicable evidence, the Executive Director, or designate, will determine whether or not the Participant is deemed eligible in accordance with this Policy. If the Participant is deemed non-eligible, he /she may not take part in the competition.

PLEASE NOTE: passports must accurately reflect the participants' name, date of birth, and gender as they appear in Sportdata. If any athlete requires a new passport in order to fulfill these requirements, Karate Canada can provide a letter of support to expedite the process. All requests for letters of support will remain confidential. For more information please contact Gillian Benson at gillian.benson@karatecanada.org.

Participants who give incorrect or misleading information may be disciplined in accordance with <u>Karate Canada's Discipline and Complaints Policy</u>.



4. AGE ELIGIBILITY

Please note the following information pertaining to age eligibility of participants in the Karate Canada National Championships.

Participants must be aware that unless they are of age to compete in the Senior division at key international events taking place during the upcoming season, they may NOT represent Canada (in such divisions) at these competitions.

4.1 U21 KATA & KUMITE

U21 athletes may compete in the age category for which they are age eligible as of the first day of the upcoming Senior & U21 Pan American (PKF) Karate Championships AND/OR the first day of the upcoming Cadet, Junior & U21 World (WKF) Championships.

4.2 SENIOR KUMITE

^{*}Please note that athletes born between August 29th and October 14th 2008, 2010, and 2012 may be eligible for more than one division at the 2026 National Championships. To participate in the JR and SR PKF and WKF JR, athletes must be age-eligible according to their age on the first day of each of these competitions.



Senior athletes must be 18-years-old or older as of the first day of the upcoming Senior & U21 Pan American (PKF) Karate Championships.

Age-eligible U21 athletes can register to compete in Senior divisions.

4.3 SENIOR KATA

Senior athletes must be minimum 16-years-old as of the first day of the upcoming Senior & U21 Pan American (PKF) Karate Championships.

Athletes aged 16, 17, 18, 19 and 20 years may compete in Senior individual and Senior team divisions. (Please note that the minimum age for Senior individual and Senior team kata at international events is 16).

5. COMPETITOR ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

All participants must be members of their provincial or territorial karate Associations and Teams (declared and paid to Karate Canada), and participants may only be pre-registered online through their PTSO's Team Manager or designated representative.

Please note: All current Senior National Team Roster kumite athletes must participate as members of their respective Provincial / Territorial Teams, in both individual and team divisions, and must be deemed eligible for participation according to their provincial/territorial requirements.

5.1 MAXIMUM NUMBER OF ENTRANTS

5.1.1 Individual Kumite

Each Province/Territory is permitted to send a maximum of three (3) competitors per individual division, in addition to all automatically invited athletes. *Automatically invited athletes must still meet team eligibility requirements set by their respective PTSO (in terms of participation in provincial selection tournaments and/or trainings, etc.).

5.1.2 Individual Kata

Each Province/Territory is permitted to send a maximum of four (4) competitors per individual division, in addition to all automatically



invited athletes. These automatically invited athletes must still meet team eligibility requirements set by their respective PTSO (in terms of participation in provincial selection tournaments and/or trainings, etc.).

5.1.3 Team Kata

Each Province/Territory is permitted to send a maximum of one (1) kata team.

Additionally, Karate Canada will accept registrations of Senior kata teams comprised of athletes from different PTSOs (all details regarding the registration process for such teams will be provided in later versions of this bulletin).

5.1.4 Para-Karate

Each Province/Territory is permitted to send a maximum of four (4) competitors per individual division, in addition to all automatically invited athletes. Automatically invited athletes must still meet team eligibility requirements set by their respective PTSO (in terms of participation in provincial selection tournaments and/or trainings, etc.).

***IMPORTANT: 2026 Membership Fees from each PTSO must have been paid in full and all required registrant information must have been provided to the Karate Canada office prior to Friday, February 6th 2026 in order for individual participant registrations of athletes and coaches from that Province / Territory to be considered valid.

6. AUTOMATIC INVITATIONS TO THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

Karate Canada will automatically invite athletes that meet one (1) of the following three (3) criteria to this National Championships:

1. All Senior athletes in good standing holding a status (International A, B or C or National A) as of sixty (60) days prior to the first day of the



National Championships, regardless of any change in weight division within Senior kumite divisions.

- 2. All Senior and U21 medallists from the previous edition of the National Championships regardless of any change in age/weight division, who are in good standing.
- 3. The two (2) top-ranked National Team Roster athletes in each Senior and U21 division (at the end of the previous season), regardless of any change in age or weight divisions, who are in good standing.

Automatic invitations to this National Championships, according to the above points, will only apply to the discipline in which the medal or rank was earned.

Automatically invited Kumite athletes may register in any eligible age &/or weight division at the Karate Canada National Championships as per the age matrix, regardless of the division in which they achieved their automatic invitation status.

All automatically invited athletes must still meet team eligibility requirements set by their respective PTSO (i.e. participation in provincial selection tournaments or training sessions, etc.)

Additionally, all automatically invited athletes must be active and current members in good standing of the National Team Roster, according to Karate Canada's STL and, following published National Team Criteria.

7. MAINSTREAM DIVISIONS

The mainstream divisions offered at this event will be:

7.1 FEMALE & MALE INDIVIDUAL KATA

- U21 (18-20 years old)
- Senior (16+ years old)

7.2 FEMALE & MALE TEAM KATA

- U21 (18-20 years old)
- Senior (16+ years old)



7.3 FEMALE INDIVIDUAL KUMITE

- U21 (18-20 years old) -50 kg, -55 kg, -61 kg, -68 kg, +68 kg
- Senior (18+): -50 kg, -55 kg, -61 kg, -68 kg, +68 kg

7.4 MALE INDIVIDUAL KUMITE

- U21(18-20 years old): -60 kg, -67 kg, -75 kg, -84 kg, +84 kg
- Senior (18+): -60 kg, -67 kg, -75 kg, -84 kg, +84 kg
- NOTE: Karate Canada will not hold Open Weight Kumite nor Team Kumite divisions at the Karate Canada National Championships.

Please see possible exceptions in section 4 of this bulletin.

8. PARA-KARATE ATHLETES

Karate Canada will host competitive Kata events for Senior female and male divisions at the 2026 Senior Karate Canada National Championships.

All Para team members are to be included on Provincial / Territorial Rosters as full members and provided with the same opportunities for team training, team attire, and funding for Nationals. It is the responsibility of the Provincial / Territorial teams to register the Paraathletes through Sportdata along with their other athletes.

8.1 ELIGIBILITY

Para athletes must have a permanent eligible impairment type and provide medical documentation detailing their diagnosis and current health condition.

Para-athletes must submit their medical form to their PTSO and include confirmation of disability as well as the designated code(s) of disability. The Medical Diagnoses Forms (MDF), (see Para Program Reference Guide) and associated documents must be emailed to Gillian Benson - gillian.benson@karatecanada.org by January 30th, 2026.

The age category (male/female in each para sport class) will be Senior as identified in the age matrix.



Each Para athlete may have one designated accredited support person to support them at the competition. This person must be registered in Sportdata and Trackie as team support and must complete all Safe Sport requirements.

8.2 PARA-KARATE SPORT CLASSES

Karate Canada has based the para divisions on the World Karate Federation (WKF) and the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) current models of Eligible Impairments.

Detailed information can be referenced at this link: <u>WKF Para-karate</u> Rules.

Athletes with more than one type of impairment will be allowed to compete in only one sport class. Athletes will be classified according to the impairment criteria of the category in which they are registered. All athletes will compete even if there is only one participant in a division.

- 1. **K-10 Visual Impairment** must compete with blindfold a) Male b) Female (K-11 mild, K-12 severe)
- 2. **K-21 Intellectual Impairment** IQ of 75 or lower on standard tests, having originated before the age of 18. Evidence of significant limitations in adaptive behaviour as expressed in conceptual, social, and practical adaptive skills. a) Male b) Female
- 3. **K-22 Intellectual Impairment** Trisomy 21 (Down Syndrome) a) Male b) Female
- 4. **K-23 Intellectual Impairment** Autism a) Male b) Female
- 5. **K-30 Physical Impairment** Wheelchair must compete in wheelchair a) Male b) Female
- 6. **K-40 SMI Physical Impairment** Standing compete without wheelchair a) Male b) Female



Classes are detailed in the classification rules for the sport, and a classifier determines the Sport Class an athlete will compete in.

Compensation Score in the form of extra points will be based on the WKF PARA KARATE MASTER LIST. Athletes without a classification must submit all documents to determine their Sport Class and attend and evaluation 1-2 days prior to competition to determine Compensation Score in the form of Extra Points. If only one athlete is in a division KC may choose not to complete the evaluation.

Karate Canada reserves the right to change or combine divisions for competitive experience. Athletes will be awarded points for the division they are registered for.

9. WILD CARD SYSTEM

Karate Canada member PTSOs will receive an allocation of wildcards directly related to the size of the teams that each registers for the Championships.

The Wildcard system helps to address several potential issues, such as teams from provinces with larger populations that may have four or five top performers in one division. This also allows top performing athletes who move from one province / territory to another mid-selection process, or top performing athletes who were forced to miss crucial provincial / territorial selection events due to illness, injury or due to the demands of the international calendar, to have an avenue for entry into the National Championships that may otherwise be closed to them.

This has no detrimental effect on the selection process that PTSOs adopt for the selection of their own teams leading up to the National Championships. It is simply an additional option that provides more flexibility to the PTSOs and the opportunity to register additional athletes that each PTSO feels has the skill level required to compete in the National Championships and / or might derive a benefit from participation.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Selection of athletes for registration in the National Championships through the "Wildcard" system will be left to the discretion of each PTSO (subject to Karate Canada approval); all PTSOs will however be expected to abide by the following minimum requirements for the registration of wildcard athletes.

To register one or more athletes in these National Championships as (a) wildcard(s), PTSOs must submit the name(s) and division(s) of the athlete(s) up to the maximum number of athletes allowed, as per the PTSO team quota allocation above – one entry = one wildcard) to Karate Canada (by email) no later than 11:59 (EST) on January 20th, 2026, along with a written confirmation that each of these athletes meets at least one of the following four criteria:

- The athlete has placed 4th in the final rankings of the most recent provincial / territorial team selections in that individual kumite division (excluding automatically invited athletes); or
- 2. The athlete has placed 5th in the final rankings of the most recent provincial / territorial team selections in that individual kumite division (excluding automatically invited athletes), and the 4th place athlete in the same division has previously been offered the wild card and has declined it; or
- 3. The athlete has placed 5th in the final rankings of the most recent provincial / territorial team selections in that individual kata division (excluding automatically invited athletes); or
- 4. Or the athlete has placed 6th in the final rankings of the most recent provincial / territorial team selections in that individual kata division (excluding automatically invited athletes), and the 5th place athlete in the same division has previously been offered the wild card and has declined it.

(Exceptional nominations of wildcards falling outside the criteria listed above may exceptionally be considered on a case-by-case basis. However, the general spirit of the criteria listed above will be respected



in approving or rejecting such nominations.)

Only athletes who are members of their PTSO, who meet at least one of the four criteria listed above, and whose names are submitted to Karate Canada by the appropriate PTSO authority (President, Executive Director or Team Head Coach) **no later than January 20th, 2026** will be eligible to compete at these National Championships as wildcards. Karate Canada will review all submitted wildcard nominations and will confirm approval of these nominations with the PTSOs **no later than January 23**rd, **2026**.

*** Please note: PTSOs must also register approved wildcards online via Sportdata by the online event registration deadline; individual athletes will be held to the published Trackie registration deadline.




10. COACH ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

All coaches must be members of their provincial or territorial karate Associations and Teams, and participants may only be pre-registered online through their PTSO's Team Manager or designated representative.

NCCP REQUIREMENTS

All NCCP (National Coaching Certification Program) training and certification requirements that will be in effect at this event can be found in the matrix below.



FIRST-TIME COACHES ON A ONE-TIME EXEMPTION MUST OCCUPY THE RIGHT-MOST POSITIONS ON THE CHART.

ALL NCCP REQUIREMENTS MUST B E COMPLETE AS OF

First-time coaches **only** may receive a one-time exemption from NCCP level requirements. All coaches must complete the following modules:

Any higher NCCP level of training or certification than those listed in Appendix 5 will also be considered as valid. Karate Canada will verify all coach NCCP credentials and records via 'The Locker" (the Coaching Association of Canada's online database) after the registration deadline, and prior to the start of the competition. Extenuating circumstances for not satisfying the established requirements may be considered by Karate Canada, on an exceptional basis and with proper justification.

Recommendations for PTSOs from the NCCP Committee:

- Provincial/Territorial Karate organizations should verify Locker transcripts of their coaches with the support of their NCCP leadership to determine any gap in training and certification.
- PTSO Coach/NCCP leads should reach out to their NCCP Committee contact for scheduling and delivering any online sport-specific modules.

PROPOSED COACH LISTS MUST BE SUBMITTED BY **DECEMBER 19th**, **2025.** ALL NCCP REQUIREMENTS MUST BE COMPLETE BY **JANUARY 20th**, **2026**.

11. REFEREE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Karate Canada will only accept registration of referees and judges meeting the following criteria for these Karate Canada National Championships:

- a) Current international (WKF or PKF) licence holder (subject to screening by the Karate Canada Referee Commission) or
- b) Current Karate Canada National licence holder (judge and/or referee)

11.1 REFEREE ACCOMMODATIONS

Karate Canada is pleased to support traveling referees by providing accommodations during these Nationals.

This support will cover room rate and taxes and is based on **double occupancy** (2 per room) for the dates of **February 19-23**, inclusively.



Referees needing accommodation outside of these pre-approved dates, for any reason, will be solely responsible for their accommodation expense.

More information will be provided to participating referees through the Chair of the Referee Commission.

Note: For referees who reside within 75km of the competition venue, a mileage subsidy will be provided for their daily travel, in place of the shared accommodation.

11.2 REFEREE BRIEFING

An in-person referee briefing will take place immediately before the start of competition on the first morning of competition at the venue.

12. REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS – SAFE SPORT

13. ONLINE PRE-REGISTRATION FOR ATHLETES, COACHES, REFEREES & DELEGATES

All participating athletes, coaches and delegates must be pre-registered online through the Sportdata website by their respective PTSO. Referees will follow a separate process via Trackie.

All PTSO delegations must have an online username and password for access to the event and pre-registration. All teams should use the same usernames and passwords which they have used for online pre-registration to these National Championships. If you do not yet have a username and password, please submit an online request to Sportdata via their website.

Provincial / Territorial Associations / Teams are responsible for the quality and accuracy of the entered registration data.

14. WAIVER & MEDICAL FORMS

All referees, PTSO coaches, team managers, delegates, and other support staff must complete a waiver via Trackie, which includes confirmation of all Safe Sport requirements.

Each competitor (kata, kumite and Para) must submit a completed and signed Waiver and Release Agreement, as well as a Medical Form, via Trackie in order to be eligible to take part in this event.



Para-athletes competing in WKF recognized divisions must submit the WKF Medical Diagnosis Form as well as the Karate Canada Waiver and Release Agreement. Para- athletes competing in Standing Mobility Impairment division must submit the full Karate Canada Medical Form, including confirmation of disability and the designated code(s) of disability. All forms must be submitted via the athletes' PTSOs.

The Karate Canada medical waivers will be uploaded via Trackie, along with citizenship confirmation. Karate Canada will notify all member PTSOs via email once these forms are available, and will provide further information regarding the process at that time. PTSOs must contact athletes about completing the required forms.

The deadline for submitting the Trackie forms is January 30th, 2026. Late forms will be accepted until February 6th, 2026, with a surcharge of \$50 applied and charged via Trackie as of January 31st.

PTSOs must ensure that all competitors, coaches, support staff, and delegates have provided the required documentation to Karate Canada by February 6th, 2026. Please note no forms will be accepted past the deadline or on-site. Incomplete forms may lead to ineligibility to compete.

15. ENTRY FEES

17. MANDATORY EQUIPMENT

All equipment (including uniforms / gis) must be WKF-branded and approved. This section is aligned with the current WKF rules at the time of publishing.

17.1 KARATE-GI

In alignment with current WKF rules of competition, please note that karate-gis including colored embroidery on the shoulders are encouraged, but *optional*, in ALL divisions (kata and kumite) at the Karate Canada National Championships. The wearing of karate-gis featuring blue, red or white shoulder embroidery by competitors will be accepted.

It is also noted that Karate Canada's National Championship is a Selection Event that selects to PKF and WKF Championships. **These events and other WKF international events do adhere fully to the WKF**



rules, where athletes must have both red and blue shoulder embroidery on gis to compete.

17.2 ACCEPTED FLAGS ON GIS

PTSOs and athletes are reminded that <u>only</u> provincial/territorial flags are allowed to be presented on qis. **Canadian flags will not be accepted.**

17.4 MEDAL PRESENTATION ATTIRE PROTOCOL



Medallists must make their way to the medal presentation area as soon as directed and must be wearing their provincial/territorial tracksuit.

- Gis pants or PTSO-approved pants (black) with a tracksuit jacket
- Sport sneakers or barefoot

Unacceptable podium attire:

- Shorts
- Ballcaps
- Carrying cellphones and/or flags
- Sandals/Slides/Flipflops

18. SEEDING OF DRAWS

Karate Canada will seed athletes in all individual division draw sheets of the Karate Canada National Championships in the following order of decreasing priority:

18.1 U21 DIVISIONS (KATA AND KUMITE)

- Top 4 KC-ranked athletes in the same division, as of February 1st, 2026**;
- All 4 medallists from the previous National Championships in the same division.
- Gold seeded higher than silver; silver seeded higher than 3rd place;
 3rd place seeded higher than 4th place.

**= applies regardless of whether the athlete is a National Team Roster member in good standing or not at the time of seeding / the event.

PLEASE NOTE: Seeding priorities indicated are only applicable if the athlete competes in the same division where she / he has previously earned the mentioned ranking points or medal.

18.2 SENIOR DIVISIONS (KATA AND KUMITE)



- International Status Holders in the same division (A, then B, then C, in decreasing order of KC ranking priority)**;
- National Status holders in the same division (in decreasing order of KC ranking priority)**;
- All 4 medallists from the previous National Championships in the same division.
- Gold seeded higher than silver; silver seeded higher than 3rd place; 3rd place seeded higher than 4th place.

**= Note: It is not necessary for athletes to be members in good standing of the National Team Roster at the time of these National Championships in order to benefit from seeding as described above.

PLEASE NOTE: Seeding priorities indicated are only applicable if the athlete competes in the same division where she / he has previously earned the mentioned status, ranking points or medal.

19. ELIMINATION FORMULA

Karate Canada will use the following elimination formulas / formats for the various individual divisions at the Karate Canada National Championships.

19.1 ALL INDIVIDUAL KUMITE DIVISIONS

The format of the competition will be confirmed within 5 days of close of registration.

Bronze medals to be awarded to both the 3rd place and 4th place athletes.

(For divisions featuring only 3 athletes, a "Round Robin" elimination formula will be used.)

19.2 ALL INDIVIDUAL KATA DIVISIONS

The format of the competition will be confirmed within 5 days of close of registration; however, as was the case in past events, an additional match will take place (in each division comprised of 4 athletes or more), in which the winners of both third places will face off, in order to determine a 3rd place winner and a 4th place winner.



Bronze medals to be awarded to both the 3rd place and 4th place athletes.

Note: Athletes facing off in this additional match for the 3rd place will be allowed to repeat a kata performed in earlier rounds.

20. VIDEO REPLAY

Karate Canada intends to make Instant Video Replay available to coaches for the medal rounds of all individual kumite divisions, to be managed in accordance with WKF rules.

21. COMPETITION RULES

Unless specified otherwise or elsewhere in the event's Information Bulletin, the competition rules which will be in effect at the Karate Canada National Championships will be the published Kata and Kumite Rules of Competition of the World Karate Federation, in effect as of January 1, 2026.

23. WEIGH-IN RULES & PROTOCOL

23.1 RULES

23.1.1 U21 and/or Senior Kumite Athletes: Acceptable Weight Variance

Kumite athletes will be required to weigh within the weight limitations of the division in which they are registered. A 0.2 kg variance for male athletes and 0.5kg variance for female athletes, above or below the weight division range is acceptable.

23.1.2 U21 and/or Senior Kumite Athletes: Not in Compliance with Weight Restrictions

Athletes who exceed the upper or lower 0.2 kg variance for male athletes, or 0.5kg variance for female athletes, in the weight range for a division will not be accepted. They will be permitted additional time to comply until the weigh-in process concludes at the end of the designated weigh-in day.

Weight categories must be respected with the weight variance allowed as per item 1 above.

- a) Kumite athletes who surpass the maximal weight (including the variance) for a division may not compete in that weight division.
- b) Kumite athletes who are unable to meet the minimal weight (including allowed variance) for a division may not compete in that weight division.

23.2 PROTOCOL

- 1. All athletes are to initially weigh-in during the officially posted time period. The amount of time allotted for weigh-ins may be increased due to the increased number of athletes.
- 2. Athletes to weigh-in wearing shorts & t-shirt but may be permitted to reduce to under-garments or if they choose, to be nude.
- 3. Privacy screens will be provided around the scale/weighing area.
- 4. No spectators are allowed during the weigh-in process.



- 5. One coach, or his or her designate, is required to attend the weigh-in for each participating team. They are not permitted to interfere in the weigh-in process.
- 6. Athletes will be weighed by same-sex individuals. Without exception, opposite-sex individuals are not permitted in the official weigh-in area.
- 7. Upon arrival, athletes must present their official event accreditation. Without exception, athletes without accreditation will not be granted an opportunity to weigh-in.
- 8. Any athlete in excess of the 0.2 kg variance for males, and 0.5kg variance for females above or below the weight division range will not be accepted; he/she will be permitted additional time up to the closing time of weigh-in process at the end of the designated weighin day.
- 9. Early-bird Weigh-in: maximum number of openings per province is determined using following ratio:

Maximum number of Athletes Permitted for "Early-bird" weigh-in	3	4	5	6	7

10. "Last-chance window" for final weigh-in opportunity: There will be a final weigh-in opportunity for those struggling to make weight. No weight restriction on who may weigh-in at this final opportunity. It will be at the end of Weigh-in day from 4:00pm-4:45pm.
